The Domestic Abuse Center (DAC) is a private, non-profit agency serving domestic violence offenders, in operation for over thirty years- accepting referrals from multiple jurisdictions in the state. DAC is also known as Batterer Intervention Program or BIP. Aside from an orientation and assessment, the DAC program consists of attendance at a minimum of twenty-six (26) group sessions, held weekly in ninety minute sessions. Duration of the DAC program can be longer if there are extenuating circumstacnes related to an individual's specific situation. DAC meets the "Solicitor Guidelines and Standards for the Approval of Domestic Violence Intervention Programs" for offenders of domestic violence who must satisfy court orders by participating in treatment. Education about individual, cultural, and family dynamics of domestic violence are included in the program.

Sistercare is the only organization that offers specialized shelter and support services for survivors of domestic violence and their children in the circuit. Sistercare, Inc. also offers a 28 week program which meets the "Solicitor Guidelines and Standards for the Approval of Domestic Violence Intervention Programs" for offenders of domestic violence who must satisfy court orders by participating in treatment. Education about individual, cultural, and family dynamics of domestic violence ar included in this program.

Dickerson Children's

Advocacy Center: 140 Gibson Rd., Lexington, SC 29072; 803-358-7200. The Dickerson Children's Advocacy Center works with children affected by physical and sexual abuse, drug endangerment, and the witnessing of domestic violence. They provide a safe and caring environment where children and their non-abusive parent(s) or guardians can receive services to victims of child abuse between the ages of 0 to 18. Providing these services in a single location can help alleviate stress and trauma that children can experience by moving between agencies.

SC Victim Assistance Network: Although not exclusive to domestic violence cases, this organization operates with the goals to ensure all crime victims receive access to assistance from the criminal justice system, to improve the quality of services provided to crime victims by victim advocates, and to ensure the criminal justice system adequately serves crime victims. Services include direct emergency and transitional housing assistance and information to victims, research, resource, and referrals to victims and services providers, legal assistance, faith-based victim services, and alliances with providers to provide medical response and treatment for sexual assault victims.
