The Domestic Abuse Center (DAC) is a private, non profit agency serving domestic violence offenders, in operation for over thirty years- accepting referrals from multiple jurisdictions in the state. DAC is also known as a Batterer Intervention Program or BIP. Aside from an orientation and assessment, the DAC program consists of attendance at a minimum of twenty six (26) group sessions, held weekly in ninety minute session. Duration of the DAC program can be longer if there are extenuating circumstances related to an individual's specific situation. DAC meets the "Solicitor Guidelines and Standards for the Approval of Domestic Violence Intervention Programs" for offenders of domestic violence who must satisfy court orders by participating in treatment. Education about individual, cultural, and family dynamics of domestic violence are included in the program.

Sistercare is the only organization that offers specialized shelter and support services for survivors of demestic violence and their children in the Lexington Circuit. Sistercare, Inc. also offers a 28 week program which meets the "Solicitor Guidelines and Standards for the Approval of Domestic Violence Intervention Programs" for offenders of domestic violence who must satisfy court orders by participating in treatment. Education about individual, cultural, and family dynamics of domestic violence are included in the program.
