## Diversion & Treatment Programs: A History

In 1972, the United States Department of Labor (DOL) initiated nine state level diversion programs under a federal grant, one of which was in Richland County, South Carolina and administered by the Circuit Solicitor. After funding from the DOL ended, in 1974, Solicitor John Foard developed the self-supporting concept of diversion programs. Programs modeled after the self-supporting concept followed in Greenville (1975), Spartanburg (1979) and Charleston (1979). In 1980, the this same model was adopted in South Carolina legislation, which formally recognized the authority of South Carolina Circuit Solicitors to establish and operate Pretrial Intervention (PTI) Programs, and set general eligibility requirements for PTI Programs. South Carolina's Circuit Solicitors established other types of diversion and treatment programs in their offices, including Alcohol Education Programs (AEP), Traffic Education Programs (TEP), Worthless Check Units (WCU), which were established by statute in 2007 and 2008.

Today, the South Carolina Offices of Circuit Solicitor offer more than twenty-four (24) diversion programs and treatment courts statewide, all of which operate under the executive authority of the Circuit Solicitor. The average duration of a diversion or intervention program is 90 days. The average duration of a treatment court program is 12-18 months. When a participant has successfully completed the program, their charges associated with their participation in the program are dismissed. Following the dismissal of charges, the participant may apply for an expungement of their record so the charges are removed entirely from their record.

The 2025 Directory of South Carolina Diversion Programs and Treatment Courts is provided by the South Carolina Commission on Prosecution Coordination (SCCPC). This Directory lists all diversion/intervention programs and treatment courts offered by the South Carolina Offices of Circuit Solicitor, which are offered to defendants as alternatives to traditional criminal prosecution. Upon successful completion of a program, related charges are dismissed and may be eligible for expungement. Defendants may participate in each diversion/intervention program and treatment court once, and may not participate in the same program more than once.
