DAC meets the "Solicitor Guidelines and Standards for the Approval of Domestic Violence Intervention Programs" for offenders of domestic violence who must satisfy court orders by participating in treatment. In 2019, we reivewed the Cedric Lamont Saunders case. He shot and killed 21-year-old Yvette Moorer in the head while he drove alongside her on U.S. 21. Investigators had thought Moorer died in a single-car wreck, but the coroner later found a bullet in Moorer's head. An autopsy showed Moorer was n the 32nd week of her pregnancy, and that the fetus died as a result of her death. Continuation and review of this case was halted in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Saunders was sentenced to life in prison in 2006.
