| <p>Through our case review in 2020, the committee was presented with issues surrounding the correlation between alcohol abuse and domestic violence fatalities. The top factor that possibly could have shown as an early indicator in our case was the abuse of alcohol within the home, as opposed to what we more frequently see with prior arrests or prior law enforcement involvement. This brought a new perspective to the committee and discussions on the need for further exploration and research into how identifying and attempting to remedy alcohol and substance abuse issues might prevent domestic fatalities. Additionally, although we did have higher than normal absences due to Covid, committee members remained engaged throughout the year and hopeful to participate when possible.
