The Solicitor's Office, along with other community partners, batterers treatment programs, law enforcement, and victims' advocacy groups work to educate batterers on taking responsibility for their actions. Each offender is provided with a letter putting the offender on notice of the state and federal penalties should the offender continue to offend. Additionally, a solicitor is present at the jail for the arraignment of every offender arrested for DV in Spartanburg County (including weekends and holidays).

This has led to better communication where we have been able to aid one another with quite a few DV cases throughout the year when specific support was needed in different areas. We plan to continue making this contact information available and more detailed for everyone who comes into contact with these cases.

This year the Committee focused on mental health services. The case we reviewed this year was a double murder-suicide that had an extensive history of mental health related issues involving the victim. This led to fruitful discussions on how we treat people who are said to be suffering from mental illness. In our particular case, the victim was always viewed as the suspect/defendant and her mental health struggles were weaponized against her in a way that made her seemingly lack credibility with law enforcement. We hope to work more closely with our behavioral health committee members to raise awareness this year surrounding mental health and domestic violence.

Police now give recommendations regarding DV resources unlike in the past. Other recommendations would be that DV offenders be served with a warrant on their second day of arrest, codifying mandatory no contact orders (see WI Statute 968.075), have police be able to issue no contact orders upon arrest (see previous statute). Horry County is getting a new DV shelter, housing DV victims tends to be one of the biggest issues along with them having steady income. We workshopped ideas involving the hospitality industry in our area, i.e. having condos or hotels host a DV family allowing discounted room and board for maid services.
